Because Vallejo is in the Sacramento Division, SSA [REDACTED] telephonically contacted that office to advise them that he had referred vallejo to SA [REDACTED] ACTING SUPERVISOR [REDACTED] was telephonically advised that SA [REDACTED] would be handling this matter out of the Sacramento Division, and he subsequently notified ASAC COVERT.

Subject: ZODIAC

SA [REDACTED] met on two separate occasions with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] of the Vallejo Police Department regarding captioned matter. These two meetings lasted a total of approximately ten hours. These investigators were interested in an interview strategy for a possible suspect ARTHUR LEIGH ALLEN. However, they indicated that they had a considerable amount of investigation to conduct prior to contacting ALLEN.

Shortly after these meetings occurred, investigators served a search warrant at ALLEN'S residence at which time they confronted him with being the "ZODIAC" killer. He denied the charges. They indicated that they had subsequently interviewed him again. On all occasions, ALLEN was calm and cooperative, but denied any involvement.

This case was left pending because the Vallejo police indicated that they wanted additional assistance in their investigation as information developed. Therefore this case was left open until 3/23/92 when [REDACTED] was contacted and provided a status report on the case. (See memo dated 3/23/92).

Because of SA [REDACTED] caseload during the last year with priority matters, especially 7-1483, 7-1511 and 7-1517, no regular memos have been placed in the file explaining the reason to have the case remain open. A memo dated 3/23/92, which is contained in this file, has requested that this matter be closed at this time.





Subject: ZODIAC

SPECIAL AGENT [redacted] met with Vallejo Police Captain [redacted] and Police Detective [redacted] on captioned case. [redacted] and [redacted] advised that they were re-initiating the "ZODIAC" serial murder investigation because of information concerning a possible suspect - ARTHUR LEIGH ALLEN. [redacted] and [redacted] were interested in designing an interview strategy for ALLEN should it become necessary to confront him.

The following synopsis of this case is provided below.

ARTHUR LEIGH ALLEN was a suspect in the original "ZODIAC" investigation in the late 1960s - early 1970s. Search warrants had been served at ALLEN'S residence at the time. The evidence which was collected included sado-masochistic pornography, dildos, blood stained clothing. Prints were also lifted from ALLEN'S trailer. However, these prints did not match any prints taken from "ZODIAC" crime scenes. ALLEN was never charged with any of the homicides.

In 1991, the Vallejo Police Department received information which resurrected ALLEN'S possible involvement in the "ZODIAC" killings. [redacted] and [redacted] re-interviewed a number of people who had information about ALLEN. [redacted] and [redacted] were advised that prior to an interview with ALLEN, they should attempt to obtain as much current information about him as possible.

[redacted] and [redacted] subsequently indicated that they had obtained a search warrant of ALLEN'S residence, the basement apartment of his deceased mother's residence in Vallejo, California. ALLEN has lived in this apartment since his release from Atascadero State Hospital. Investigators described this apartment as very dark and dreary, almost "museum like". During the service of the warrant, [redacted] and [redacted] interviewed ALLEN about the "ZODIAC" killings, and ALLEN denied any involvement in the murders. [redacted] and [redacted] described ALLEN as very amiable, calm and cooperative throughout their interview. He told investigators he was a "nice guy", although he [redacted] and [redacted] derived pleasure from sadistic type pornography. ALLEN [redacted] and [redacted] stated that an audio tape which they found during the search [redacted] was a tape in which he (ALLEN) is spanking a young boy who was [redacted]

pain. According to ALLEN, he found this tape to be sexually stimulating.

ALLEN was shown a piece of yellow lined paper which contained a "menu" for making a bomb. ALLEN told investigators that he never saw that piece of paper before, and denied having left several bombs in a friend's basement years ago.

Every item in ALLEN'S residence was searched, including all of ALLEN'S the books, personal belongings, diaries, records, etc. No evidence tying ALLEN directly to the "ZODIAC" murders was recovered.

The only assistance which SA [redacted] was able to provide Vallejo Police Department at this time, was to suggest that prior to future contacts with ALLEN, investigators should have all of their other interviews completed so they had as much background information as possible on ALLEN.

Following two meetings with [redacted] and [redacted] no information was received regarding the status of the investigation. [redacted] was contacted on March 23, 1991 regarding captioned matter. [redacted] indicated that his department was still investigating ALLEN as the ZODIAC killer. [redacted] indicated that a surviving victim from the ZODIAC series of murders had positively identified ALLEN as the ZODIAC killer. [redacted] was currently in Germany following up on several leads.

[redacted] indicated that the one major problem in the current investigation was that ALLEN'S handwriting did not match "ZODIAC'S" handwritings. The experts explained that the only explanation for this would be if ALLEN would have been able to develop a "false handwriting".

[redacted] indicated that they have interviewed ALLEN on several occasions during the last year. During all of these interviews, ALLEN was very cooperative with police, but continues to deny that he is the "ZODIAC".

[redacted] advised that there were two additional interviews to be conducted on this case. These interviews were with people who have known ALLEN for a long period of time, and therefore would be able to provide a significant amount of background on him - especially during the time that "ZODIAC" was committing his homicides. Once these interviews have been conducted, [redacted] indicated that he and [redacted] will present a full review of the case to the Sonoma County District Attorney's Office for an opinion regarding possible prosecution of ALLEN. If the DA refuses to file charges against ALLEN, Vallejo Police Department will close its investigation on the "ZODIAC" case. [redacted] indicated that he will notify SA [redacted] as to the date and time of the meeting with the District Attorney's office so

that she can attend.

Vallejo has requested no further assistance on this case, and it is therefore recommended that this case be closed at this time.

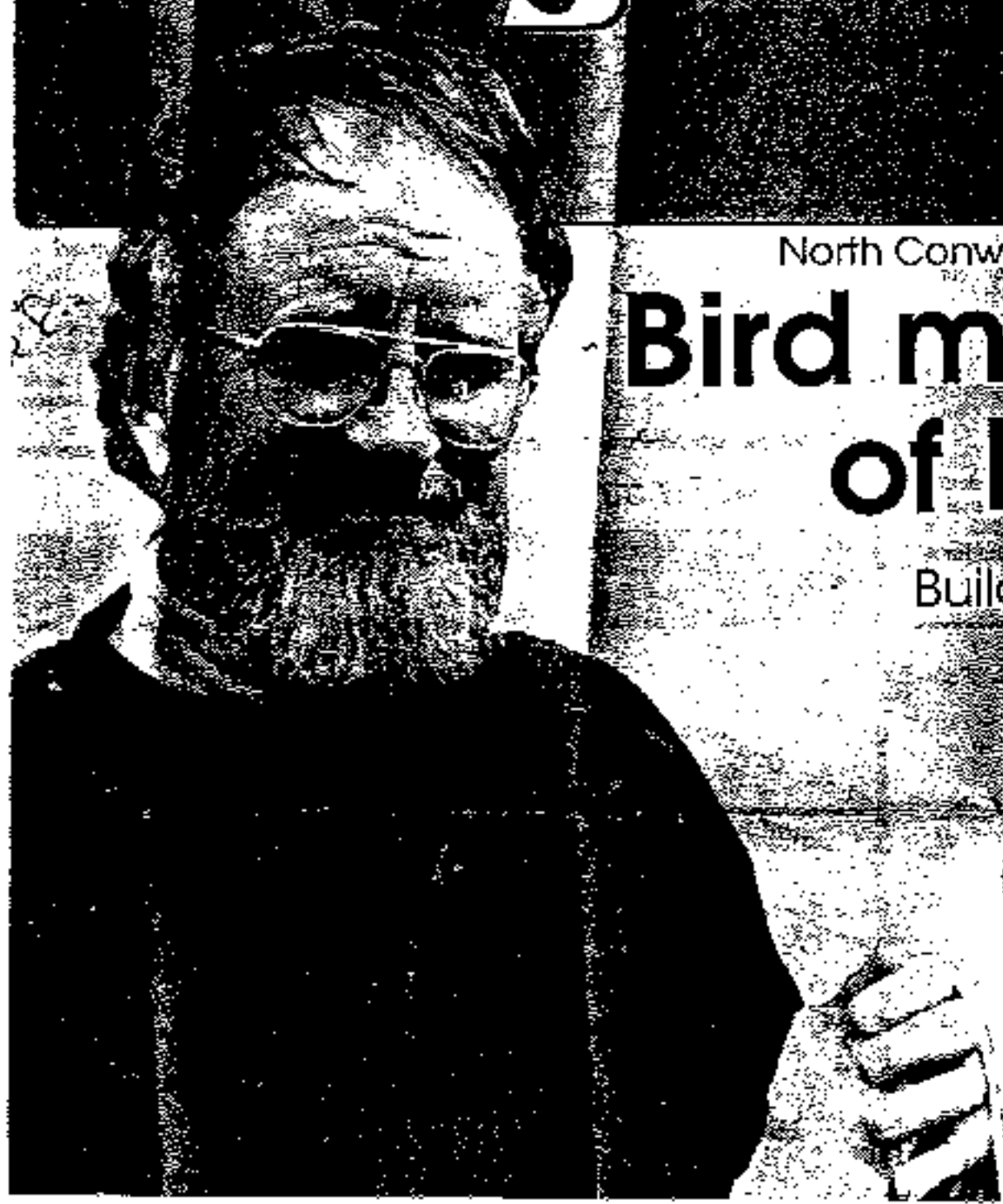

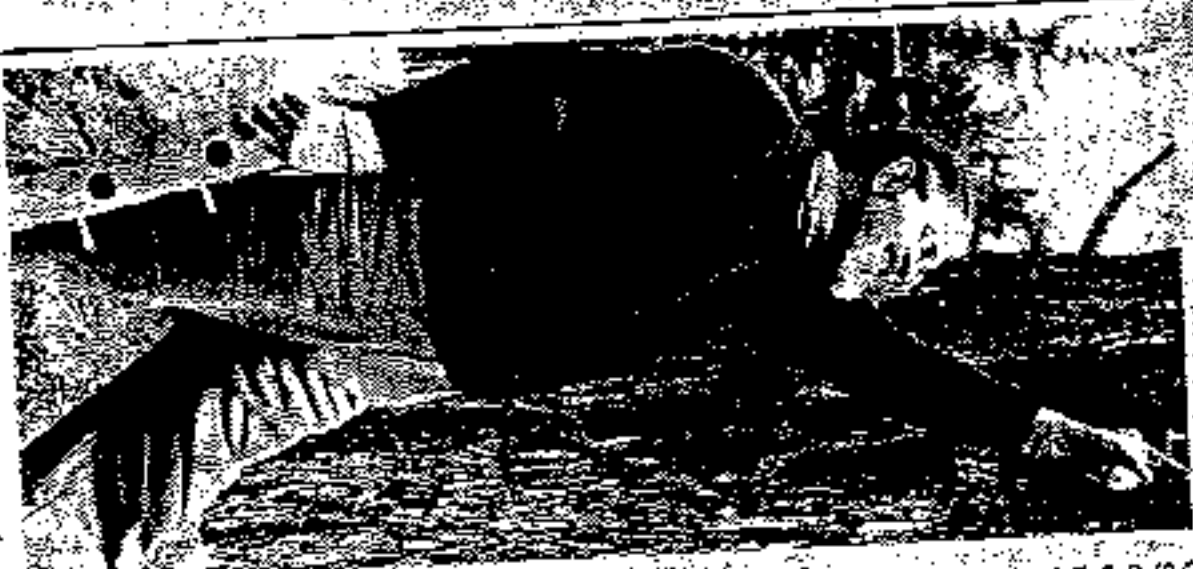

Eastman cites the Eastern Bluebird
as one example. He points out that
ornithologists in the 1870s and 1930s
determined that bluebirds were quite
specific about the dimensions of the
nesting cavities they chose to nest in.

This dimension was very
important.
Eastman explains that Country
Ecology manufactures four stock lines
of bird houses. In addition to the
bluebird house, houses for Tree
Swallows, Chickadees and Wrens.
Other species, such as the Tree
Swallow, will nest within 50 feet of each
other. Each is species-specific and each
comes with rules and directions for
most effective use. On special order,
the company will also make larger-
sized nesting boxes for the
spectacularly colored Wood Duck and
Kestrel and Screech Owl.

Country Ecology sells about 1,000
bird houses per year on a national
basis and sales are steadily growing.
Locally they may be purchased at
Conway Supply, Conway Feed
Exchange and Moukonborov's
Chickadee Station.

"Our best outlets are the specialty
stores — stores like Chickadee Station
— places whose owners and staff are
hyper on ecology. At places like this
you can't have a master's degree in
ornithology behind the cash register.
The people who patronize these places
are also the sort of people who are
willing to pay a little extra for a quality
product," Eastman says.

He also notes that this coming
season his line of bird houses and bird
feeders will be featured in the Dunsmuir
Christmas catalogue. "I'm also
negotiating with one of the major
catalogues for a contract that would
involve 7,000 houses annually. For
productivity at that level, I'd have to
subcontract most of the labor."

What type of person does it take to
build a better birdhouse? Eastman's
resume recalls a medley of past
themes. He has degrees in forestry and
environmental science from the
University of Washington. As an army
helicopter pilot he logged 1,300 combat
hours in Vietnam with numerous
decorations. He flew helicopters

bird wildlife by selective logging,
pruning and planting.

Eastman also pursues a part-time
career as a writer, contributing articles
and color photography to magazines
such as *Birds of the World*, *Wildbird* and
Bird Watcher's Digest. His literary
talent runs in the family. Several of his
sisters are involved in publishing and
public relations while two of his
brothers, Steve and Tom, are publisher
and editor respectively of the *Mountain
Star*.

How did Eastman get into the
business of building bird houses and
feeders?

"I've always fed the birds. And I've
always had an interest in forest
products. Plus I've always had an
interest in recycling waste. The boards
I use for the backing and sides is
lumber that's been out in the weather
too long to be commercially valuable.
The pine slabs that I use for the front
of the houses are sawmill waste.

"A few years ago I was working in a
sawmill. I just saw all these interesting
forms and shapes passing in front of
me. Then something lit up and I made
the connection with bird houses. These
two useless items could be combined to
make a high quality, low priced
product. From there things just
seemed to click."

Build a better bird house, it seems,
and the world will beat a path to your
door.

DAVE EASTMAN

Dave Eastman, the Bird Man of Eaton

Following Mother Nature's rules to build better birdhouses

Dave Eastman stops his high pitched electric saw and steps outside his Eaton workshop. He points to a bird house set five feet high on a post in a grassy area next to the garden.

"A lot of people think that attracting nesting birds involves nothing more than hanging up a few bird houses that they've bought at the supermarket. When they don't succeed, they conclude that bird houses don't work," he says.

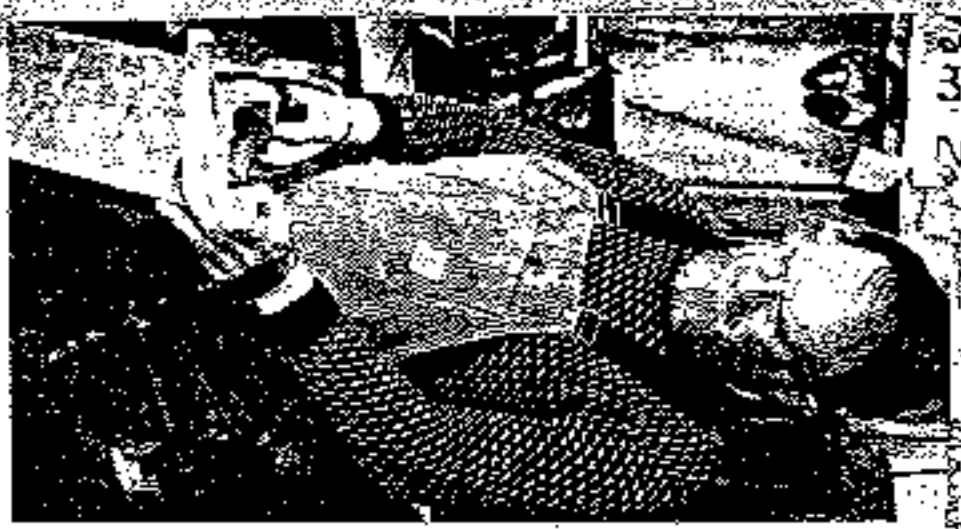
"Actually there are a few simple rules you need to observe to attract nesting birds. Mother Nature made these rules. When we observe these rules, we're far more likely to succeed in attracting birds to nest on our property. Here at my firm, Country Ecology, we not only build bird houses that conform to Mother Nature's rules, we also try to educate the consumer in the most effective ways to use the product."

Eastman cites the Eastern Bluebird as one example. He says that in Eaton, Colorado, that a significant

"They determined that they nest in cavities roughly five inches in diameter and seven inches deep. They seek an entrance hole one and one half inches in diameter. The bird houses I make conform to those dimensions and, to the extent economically possible, look like a natural nesting cavity in a natural snag."

"But even after the consumer has purchased one of my bluebird houses, there are still some rules to ensure success. They are printed right here on the tag. The house should be placed in an open area but within 25 feet of a tree," he continues, pointing out that when fledgling bluebirds take their first flight, they can only fly a short distance. When they have to make their first landing, it should be in a tree so they are safe from predators on the ground. Further, he notes, the owner of a small plot of land would not benefit from buying more than one bluebird house. Bluebirds are highly territorial and will tolerate another pair only within a 500 foot radius. Put up two bird houses spaced closer than that and only one will be successful."

Eastman explains that Country Ecology has been an explorer in bird houses since the 1920s and 1930s. He says that in the 1920s and 1930s, birdhouses were made of wood and only one will be successful.

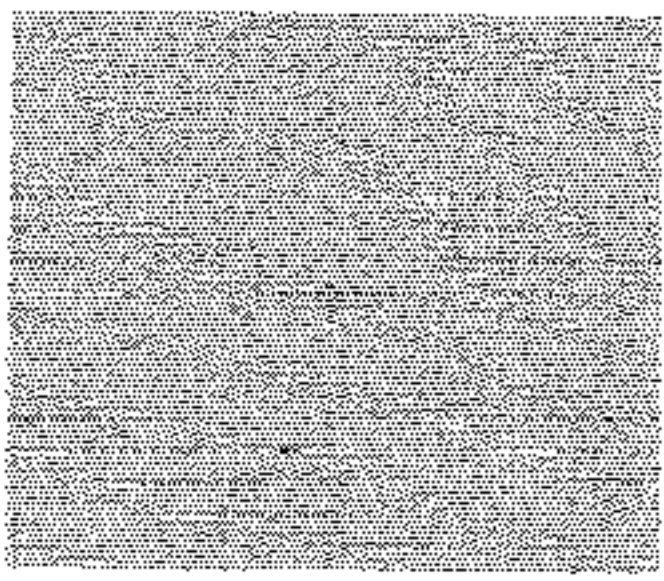

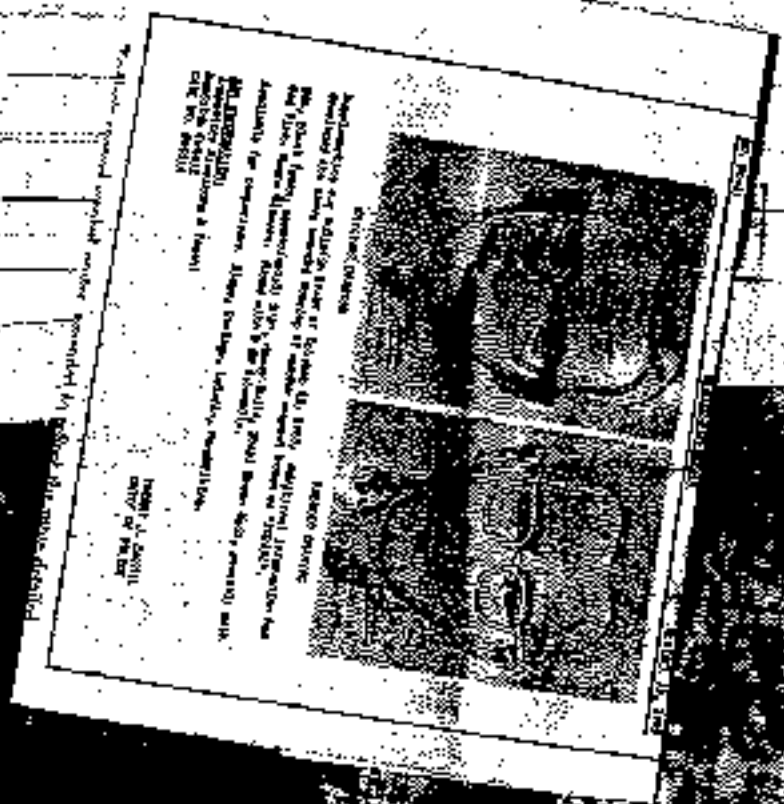

"THIS is the Zodiac. Twelve signs will die..."
 That frightful letter, sent to the New York Post newspaper, launched one of the biggest manhunts in the history of the Big Apple and sparked fears that the next victim would be a Leo.

It tied together three apparently random shootings in a city used to murder, and announced a new terror: The Zodiac Killer was striking! Before the letter arrived, two shootings were lost on the police blotter among countless other senseless crimes.

But, the letter continued: "The first sign is dead on March 8, 1990, 1:45 a.m. The second sign is dead on March 29, 1990, 2:57 a.m. The third sign is dead on May 31, 1990, 2:04 a.m."

On the same page, in a precisely drawn circle representing the astrological zodiac, were the symbols of three birth signs of the three shooting victims. A potential killer was on the loose, they concluded.

He was trying to kill people based on their astrological signs.

Their worst fears were confirmed when a fourth victim was shot in the chest in Central Park. Near his almost lifeless body, investigators found another note in the same handwriting as the others, filled with astrological references.

OF the three previous victims, one had died. They were:

- Mario Orso (Scorpio), a 50-year-old father of two, walking with a cane, was shot March 8 in Brooklyn.
- Germaine Montenegro (Gemini), 33, shot March 29 while leaving a subway station, also in Brooklyn.
- Joseph Proce (Taurus), shot May 31 while walking home

with a cane in Queens. He died several weeks later because of an infection caused by the shooting.

Now, panic is spreading through New York - informed sources believe that Zodiac's next victim will be a Leo. That fear reached wild-fire proportions when the New York Daily News published a story by its astrologer Joyce Jillson.

"Those born under the sign of Leo are advised to stay in on

the evening of July 26," she wrote. "That is the sign with all of the earmarks of Zodiac's next victim."

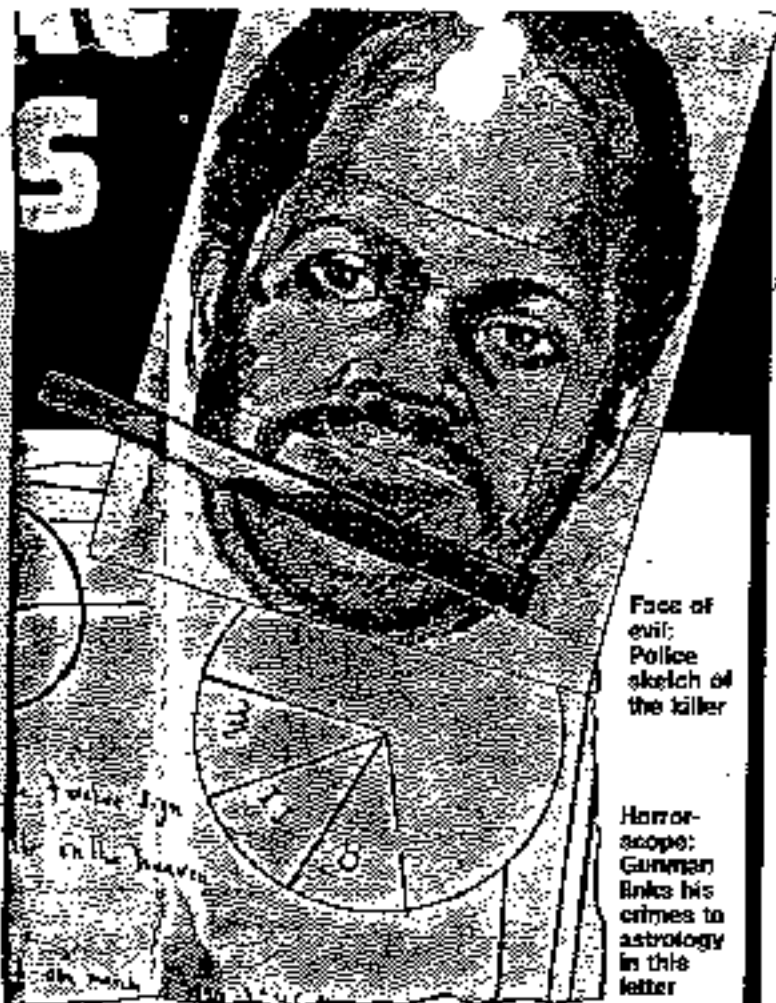
The most baffling aspect of the case, police said, was how Zodiac knew the astrological signs of his victims, none of whom apparently knew him.

The fourth victim, Larry Parham (Cancer) was recovering from his wounds when he gave the police a key clue to Zodiac's method.

The night before he was

shot, he said, he was approached in Central Park by a man who fit the description of Zodiac.

"He started talking to me for no reason but was real friendly," Parrish said. "He asked me what was my zodiac. I said Cancer. He said he was a Taurus."

Police believe that Zodiac has attacked consistently except for a period that included his own sign — Taurus.

They discount the theory that he is the same man who called himself The Zodiac Killer and is believed responsible for 37 deaths in San Francisco between 1968 and 1978. He is still at large. But police say the New York version is a copycat.

EYEWITNESSES provided authorities with sufficient information to come up with a composite drawing of Zodiac.

The day after it was published in the newspapers, they were flooded with more than 1,000 calls from people who claimed they had seen him.

Mayor David Dinkins offered a \$10,000 reward for in-

formation leading to the capture of the killer. Police spokesman Det. Joseph McConville told The GLOBE: "We have more than 50 detectives working on this case."

"Each time we come up with a new piece of evidence, we sit down and toss it around to see if we can fit it into the pattern."

"This case is like a giant puzzle. Every bit of information, no matter how silly or insignificant it may seem, is being pieced together by computer to make a complete picture."

Another New York administration official, speaking under the condition that his name would not be revealed, said: "I've never seen this city so afraid. People are reading their horoscopes to see if it is safe for them to go out."

"The fear has spread to all levels of society. High-powered stockbrokers, who live on Fifth Avenue, have told me they look over their shoulders when they are out on the streets during the times, between midnight and 6 a.m., when Zodiac has struck."

"This man has his hands around the throat of the entire city."

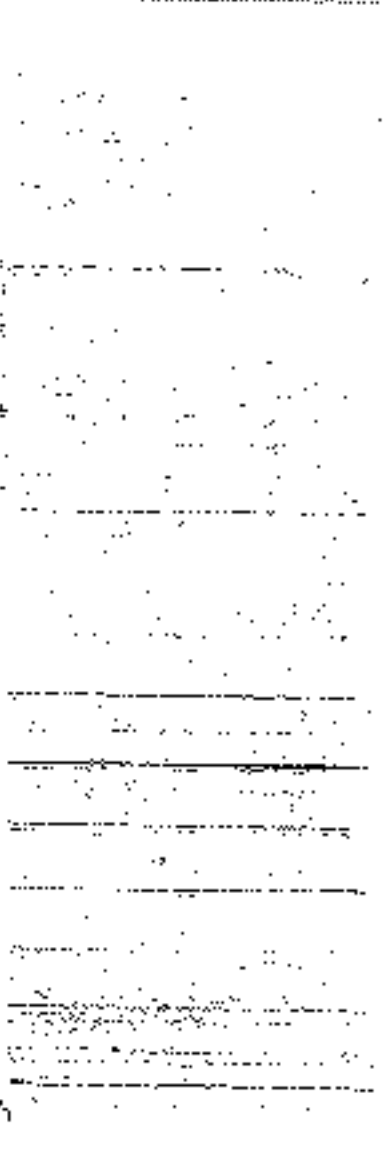

5 On July 4, 1969, I was Sergeant with the Vallejo Police
6 Department and actually was one of the officers on the crime
7 scene; wherein, Darlene Ferrin was shot to death, and a [REDACTED]
8 [REDACTED] was shot numerous times but subsequently lived.
9 This shooting was later attributed to a person who identi-
10 fied himself as the Zodiac. The person that identified him-
11 self as the Zodiac wrote letters to the Vallejo Times Herald
12 after the killing of Ferrin bragging that he had done the
13 killing and describing how it was done. These descriptions
14 were accurate and could only have been known to the killer
15 and law enforcement. I actually assisted in some of the
16 investigation back in 1969. One of the primary investiga-
17 tors on this initial investigation was a Sergeant [REDACTED]
18 [REDACTED] of the Vallejo Police Department who has since retired.
19 The location of this killing, Blue Rock Springs, is in the
20 City of Vallejo, County of Solano, State of California.

21 In approximately 1975, now-retired Detective [REDACTED]
22 [REDACTED] was assigned to do any follow up necessary on the
23 Zodiac case. It should be noted approximately once a month
24 somebody would call in with some type of information regard-

██████████ to follow up this information. None of the information from 1969 to this date in 1991 has resulted in the arrest of the Zodiac killer. Detective ██████████ retired in September 1989 from the Vallejo Police Department. He was retained from that date forward on a contract-type basis to do follow up on any information that may come in regarding the Zodiac.

In late December 1990, a call was received from Detective ██████████ of the San Jose Police Department regarding an individual who he had arrested for armed robbery who indicated he knew the name of the Zodiac Killer. This call was referred to retired Detective ██████████ I have been informed by the retired Detective ██████████ that he contacted Detective ██████████ of the San Jose Police Department and was advised that in custody was a ██████████ presently incarcerated in the Santa Clara County Jail. The name of ██████████ was well-known to myself and retired Detective ██████████ The ██████████ family had been prominent in the Vallejo Area in the 1940's, 1950's, and 1960's, and thought to have connections with Organized Crime. ██████████ was arrested in Oregon in 1972 for armed robberies of restaurants. He was sent to prison in Oregon and served approximately two years of a ten-year sentence. His most recent arrest in San Jose by Detective ██████████ was for at least nine armed robberies of restaurants. He is to be prosecuted as a career criminal and has the potential of serving thirty plus

years in prison. He is now fifty years of age. Detective [redacted] indicates that [redacted] will not divulge what information he has regarding the Zodiac unless some type of deal is made regarding his present offenses.

In early January 1991, I and retired Detective [redacted] contacted [redacted] at the Santa Clara County Jail. [redacted] refused to divulge any information regarding the name of this person he knew as the Zodiac without first being offered a deal; wherein, all of the charges against him were dropped. Retired Detective [redacted] and I refused to make any type of deal like this. [redacted] was asked how he knew this individual he would not name was the Zodiac, and he made a statement, "He told me he was going to San Francisco and kill a cab driver. The next day or so a cab driver was killed in San Francisco, and the Zodiac took credit for it." [redacted] subsequently agreed to give the name he knew to be the Zodiac to his Attorney [redacted] a deputy public defender of Santa Clara County.

Throughout January of 1991, subsequent meetings were held with [redacted] and [redacted] immediate boss [redacted] regarding the information [redacted] had. They refused to divulge any further information without some concrete deal being given to [redacted] which we refused to do.

len. I contacted retired Detective ██████████ and he
advised me that one of the primary suspects in the Zodiac
case was investigated back in the early 1970's was an Arthur

On February 6, 1991, retired Detective ██████████ and I
went to Department of Justice, Sacramento Homicide Unit.
This unit is the receptacle for all Zodiac cases investi-
gated by various police departments throughout the State of
California. The person in charge of this division is an
Agent ██████████ Agent ██████████ supplied us with the
reports pertaining to the investigation of Arthur Leigh Al-
len, WM, DOB 121833. These records reflected the primary
investigation involving Allen was conducted by the San Fran-
cisco Police Department, specifically Inspector ██████████ and
Inspector ██████████

Attachment A to this affidavit is a copy of the City of
Manhattan Beach Police Department reported dated July 19,
1971, which indicates how Inspectors ██████████ and ██████████
became aware of Arthur Leigh Allen through information sup-

1 I have been informed by retired [redacted] that on
2 February 5, 1991, he was able to contact now retired Inspec-

6 trailer in Santa Rosa, and that present during the time of
7 the service of this search warrant was Arthur Leigh Allen.
8 [redacted] indicated that there was nothing linking Allen to
9 the Zodiac case found in the trailer. [redacted] indicated
10 that Allen cooperated with the investigation and wrote hand-
11 writing exemplars with both his right and left hand (Allen
12 is ambidextrous). [redacted] indicated that handwriting sam-
13 ples of Arthur Leigh Allen were submitted to handwriting
14 experts with known writings of the Zodiac killer. Experts
15 indicated that the handwriting was similar but definitely
16 was not that of the Zodiac killer.

17 [redacted] indicated that one handwriting expert, iden-
18 tified as [redacted] Department of Justice Document Exam-
19 iner, indicated that if writing had been a product of a
20 mental state, the writing of a subject can be different when
21 in a different mental state, or it could be a case of an
22 intentional deception. And with the talents that Allen has
23 (writes with both hands), this could be done. [redacted] rec-
24 ommendation was, "Do not eliminate this subject because of
25 handwriting." Another handwriting expert, [redacted]
26 who examined the known writing of the Zodiac, as well as
27 Allen's indicated he did not feel a mental state would alter

handwriting. [redacted] indicated that he was never able to reconcile this problem.

[redacted] also indicated when serving the search warrant, he had obtained finger and palm prints of subject Allen which were compared with fingerprints found on the cab being driven by Paul Stine, their victim of a Zodiac homicide on October 11, 1969. They were unable to match fingerprints. [redacted] went on to indicate that there were so many fingerprints in this public cab, that it is unknown that, if in fact, they have the Zodiac's fingerprints at the crime scene or not, and that he also indicated that in some of the letters that the Zodiac had bragged that he put airplane glue on his fingers to obliterate any fingerprints.

[redacted] stated that of all the suspects they looked at in the Zodiac case, he felt that Arthur Leigh Allen was the most viable.

[redacted] indicated that he did not attempt to search the residence of Arthur Leigh Allen's mother of 32 Fresno Street in the City of Vallejo. He relied on Arthur Leigh Allen's [redacted] who was cooperating with the investigation to look through Allen's room which was in the basement of this residence. [redacted] informed him that he had observed some cryptogram-type materials, but he was unsure if they were related to the Zodiac. No further action was taken regarding a search of 32 Fresno. However, [redacted] did indicate that he found out later that Arthur Leigh Allen's spent at least two days per week staying at

1 his mother's residence and still maintained his downstairs
2 basement bedroom. That, in fact, Arthur Leigh Allen's
3 mother would travel abroad frequently, and during these
4 spans of sometimes months at a time, Arthur Leigh Allen
5 would reside in the family residence of 32 Fresno Street,
6 Vallejo. This information was obtained by [redacted] from
7 Arthur Leigh Allen's [redacted]

8 [redacted] further indicated that Arthur Leigh Allen's
9 name was never published in any media to his knowledge, and
10 that the only persons who would know this name are law en-
11 forcement personnel directly related to the Zodiac investi-
12 gation, or someone that Arthur Leigh Allen had personally
13 dealt with.

14 Retired Detective [redacted] contacted retired Department
15 of Justice Agent [redacted] [redacted] assisted [redacted] in
16 the investigation of Allen. [redacted] indicated that he had
17 no knowledge of any media attention given to Arthur Leigh
18 Allen regarding him being a suspect in the Zodiac case. To
19 [redacted] knowledge, the only persons that had any informa-
20 tion regarding Allen were law enforcement personnel.

21 Detective [redacted] and myself are both aware of the media
22 attention given to the Zodiac case in the Vallejo Area and
23 know of no incidents where Arthur Leigh Allen's name was
24 mentioned as being a suspect in the Zodiac case. This leads
25 me to believe that [redacted] had to have had personal
26 contact with Arthur Leigh Allen or with a close associate of
27 Arthur Leigh Allen to obtain the name of Lee Allen.

I am aware that the Zodiac wrote at least twelve letters to newspapers in San Francisco, Vallejo, and Los Angeles, and at least one letter to an attorney by the name of [REDACTED]. These letters were primarily taunting the police that they would never catch him and exhibiting a score indicating that he was beating San Francisco Police Department. Some of these letters also contained cryptograms which were supposed to spell out the reasons for the killings and the Zodiac's name. Numerous attempts have been made to crack these cryptograms with dubious results. Although the Zodiac claimed many killings in the State of California, the ones that most closely can be attributed to him, and that are in the Vallejo Area are as follows:

(1) December 20, 1968 - Lake Herman Road near Vallejo, Solano County Sheriff's Department Jurisdiction. Victims - Betty Jensen and David Farraday. The weapon used in these killings was a .22 caliber semi-automatic pistol. It is unknown if any personal articles were taken from either Jensen or Farraday. Expended .22 caliber slugs and casings available for comparison.

(2) July 4, 1969 - Blue Rock Springs Area, Vallejo, California, Vallejo Police Department jurisdiction. Victims - Darlene Ferrin, deceased; and [REDACTED] shot numerous times but lived. Weapon used - a 9 mm. semi-automatic pistol. Expended slugs and casing available for comparison. It is unknown if any personal items were taken from Ferrin or [REDACTED]

1 (3) September 27, 1969 - Lake Berryessa Area, Napa County
2 Sheriff's Department jurisdiction. Victims - Cecilia
3 Shepard, deceased; and ██████████ stabbed numerous

6 wooden handle with two brass rivets and tape around the

21 aforementioned Yellow cab. The person who identified
22 himself as the Zodiac subsequently sent a letter taunt-
23 ing the San Francisco Police Department regarding the

25 of the missing shirt of Paul Stine.

26 In the late 1970's the FBI at their training facility
27 at Quantico, Virginia, set up a special unit identified as

2 gram. This unit was made up of psychiatrists, psycholo-
3 gists, and FBI Agents whose primary function was to make a
4 profile on violent serial killers and sexual violators. The
5 persons in this unit interviewed convicted mass murders and
6 sexual violators to determine what motivated them. They
7 were able to develop profiles of serial killers which have
8 had uncanny results in identifying the traits of responsi-
9 bles in serial murder cases.

10 On February 7, 1991, retired Detective [REDACTED]
11 contacted [REDACTED] psychologist, VICAP Unit, Quantico,
12 Virginia. [REDACTED] was familiar with the Zodiac case. He was
13 informed of the investigation by Detective [REDACTED] in
14 1971, and the more recent information obtained from [REDACTED]
15 [REDACTED] in 1991. [REDACTED] indicated that his experience
16 would show that the Zodiac killer probably gained as much

The following facts establish the reasonable and probable cause upon which your affiant's statements are based:

The affiant, [REDACTED], declares the following: That he is an Inspector of Police with the San Francisco Police Department. That he is assigned to the Homicide Detail. That on October 11, 1969 one PAUL STINE, a taxi cab driver was found murdered in his taxi at Cherry and Washington Streets, San Francisco. That PAUL STINE died from gunshot wound in brain. That a 9 MM slug was recovered from said wound. That a 9 MM casing was recovered in the taxi cab. That a portion of the gray and white stripe shirt which was bloodstained and which Stine was wearing was torn off and missing when the body was found.

That on October 15, 1969 a letter was received by the Editor of the San Francisco Chronicle. That writer of said letter claimed that he was the murderer of the taxi driver PAUL STINE. That included in said letter was a portion of gray and white stripe cloth which bore stains. That laboratory examination of said cloth established it to be same material as missing from the shirt of deceased PAUL STINE. That further laboratory examination and comparison determined the stains on said cloth to be human blood, of the same type as deceased PAUL STINE. That the writer of said letter identified himself as "ZODIAC."

That a total of 17 letters have been received by San Francisco, Vallejo and Los Angeles newspapers and by Attorney [REDACTED]. That the postmarks on said letters indicate mailing dates from July 31, 1969 to March 22, 1971. That writer of said letters identifies himself as "ZODIAC." That the hand printing on all of said letters and envelopes has been examined by Mr. [REDACTED] Questioned Documents Examiner with the State Department of Justice C.I.I. in Sacramento. That in Sherwood Morrell's expert opinion all said envelopes and letters were printed by the same person. That writer of said letters set forth the following information in said letters:

That he used a flashlight attached to gun barrel to shoot couples in Lovers Lane area at night. That he intended to shoot the tires off a school bus and "shoot the kiddies as they come bouncing out."

That he was responsible for the following murders and attempted murders:

Riverside, California, October 30, 1966
Victim: Cheri J. Bates

Solano County, December 20, 1968
Victims: Betty Jensen and David Farraday

Vallejo, California, July 4, 1969
Victims: Darlene Ferrin and [REDACTED]

Napa County, September 27, 1969
Victims: Cecilia Shepard and [REDACTED]

San Francisco, October 11, 1969
Victim: Paul Stine

Affiant declares that the aforementioned murders and attempted murders were committed on dates indicated. That the offenses in Solano County, Vallejo, California and Napa, California were Lovers Lane areas or situations.

That also included in said letters were codes in the form of Cryptograms. That when decoded out of said Cryptograms reads in part as follows:

b7c

"I like killing people because it is so much fun.

It is more fun than killing wild game in the forest because man is the most dangerous animal of all."

That a total of three portions of bloodstained shirt of deceased PAUL STINE were contained in said letters in which writer identifies himself as "ZODIAC."

That Affiant further declares that on or about July 20, 1971, he received a letter from the Manhattan Beach Police Department indicating that a Mr. [REDACTED] had read news accounts of Zodiac killings in San Francisco area and had contacted them concerning a possible suspect. That on July 23, 1971 the affiant contacted Mr. [REDACTED] by telephone.

That on Monday, July 26, 1971 the affiant traveled to Torrance, California where he interviewed Mr. [REDACTED] at his place of business, [REDACTED], California. That Mr. [REDACTED] states as follows:

That he resides in Southern California at [REDACTED], California. That he formerly resided in the San Francisco Bay Area. That he has known a man whom he identifies as ARTHUR LEIGH ALLEN for over ten years. That he attended College with Arthur Allen's brother, [REDACTED].

That on or about December of 1967 he was in the Allen home at 32 Fresno Street, Vallejo, California. He is positive that this occurred not later than January 1, 1968 because he moved to Southern California on January 1, 1968. That in December, 1967, while at 32 Fresno Street, Vallejo, he was engaged in a conversation with Arthur Leigh Allen about hunting. That Arthur Leigh Allen started a conversation about a book which he had read called "The Most Dangerous Game" which concerns the hunting of men.

That Arthur Allen stated that it would be great sport to hunt people. Arthur Allen went on to describe how you could seek out victims in Lovers Lane Areas at night. Attach a flashlight to a gun barrel and shoot them. As there would be no motive the police would never catch you. You could then send confusing letters to the police. Allen also mentioned in this conversation shooting the tires off a school bus and shooting the kids as "they came bounding out."

Allen went on to state that he had been thinking about it for a long time. He stated he would call himself "ZODIAC." At this point witness [REDACTED] told Allen that it sounded childish or stupid. Allen then became angry and told [REDACTED], "I don't care what you think," I've thought about it a long time and that's the name I'm going to use." When [REDACTED] went home that evening, he recalls telling his wife that he did not intend to see Arthur Allen again because Allen was acting strange.

Affiant asked [REDACTED] if having read news accounts about Zodiac killings he may have associated said news accounts which his conversation with Allen. He states that this is not the case. He can recall the conversation. He can recall his own responses and is positive Allen made the statements as outlined. He is positive that the date of said incident was before January 1, 1968. He states that he would testify to same under oath in court.

That a background investigation was made by investigating Inspectors as to the reliability of Mr. [REDACTED]. That Mr. [REDACTED] is married and lives with his wife and children at [REDACTED], California.

That [REDACTED] is a college graduate.

b7c

states that [redacted] is a "very solid person" not given to exaggeration or telling of falsehoods.

That Mrs. [redacted], sister-in-law of Arthur Leigh Allen confirms Donald Cheney's reliability.

Mr. [redacted], brother of Arthur Leigh Allen, also confirms [redacted] reliability stating that "if [redacted] said that to you, I would have believed same to be true."

That the investigating inspectors can find no ulterior motive on the part of Donald Cheney in making statement to police concerning his conversation with Arthur Leigh Allen in December, 1967.

Affiant further declares that all suspect letters which identify writer as Zodiac and which set forth method and detail of killings were mailed after January 1, 1968.

That the Investigating Officers in this case obtained exemplars of Arthur Leigh Allen's handprinting. That said exemplars were submitted to [redacted] C.I.I. Documents Examiner.

That on July 29, 1971, [redacted] advised that he had compared exemplars with the suspect letters and that said printing was not the same.

That in further investigation it was learned that Arthur Leigh Allen is left handed. That as a child he was made to write with his right hand. That he now is ambidextrous.

That on August 4, 1971, at 11:00 a.m., Inspector [redacted] and Sgt. [redacted], Vallejo Police Department, interviewed with Mr. [redacted], General Supervisor of the Greater Vallejo Recreation District. Mr. [redacted] says he has known Arthur Allen about five years. Says he knows Arthur Allen to have proficiency in using both hands well. He knows Arthur shoots weapons with proficiency. Mr. [redacted] stated that for the last two years, Arthur Allen had brought up the Zodiac case in conversation and he felt that Arthur Allen had an interest in the Zodiac case. Mr. [redacted] stated that he had seen several guns in the home of Arthur Allen, believed them to be .22 Caliber revolvers and at least one automatic. Mr. [redacted] recalls that Allen on more than one occasion admitted to shooting with special sights for firing in the dark. Mr. [redacted] stated that about 18 months ago, he and his wife visited Arthur Allen at Allen's home in Vallejo, California. Mr. [redacted] recalls Allen obtaining from a metal box some letters containing several pages of legal terminology and several pages of the letters had symbols or codes or cryptograms which were unusual to both Mr. [redacted] and his wife.

That on August 4, 1971, at 10:30 a.m., the Affiant, with Inspector [redacted] and Sgt. [redacted] of the Vallejo Police Department interviewed Arthur Leigh Allen in Vallejo, California.

That Arthur Allen stated he could not recall having made the statements attributed to him by [redacted] in 1967. Allen stated he had read the book, "The Most Dangerous Game" in the 11th Grade. States it was the best thing he had read in High School. Arthur Allen stated he had read about the Zodiac murders in the newspapers but after the initial reading did not follow it any longer, as it was too morbid. Later in said interview, Allen was asked if he was in Southern California in 1966. His response was, "You mean about the Riverside killing?" The information on the killing in Riverside in 1966 was not made public until November 1970.

Arthur Allen volunteered that he had been questioned by a Vallejo Police Sergeant after the murder at Lake Berryessa in Napa County. (Killing occurred September 27, 1969, approximately 6:00 p.m. by knife).

He stated on this particular weekend he had gone alone to a place called Salt Point near Fort Ross, California, diving. The only people that saw him there were a serviceman from Treasure Island and his wife. He did not recall names of said individuals. He returned to Vallejo at approximately 4:00 p.m. and recalls talking to a neighbor shortly after he drove into his driveway. Allen stated he had neglected to inform the Vallejo officer about having been seen by this neighbor at the time he was questioned. Allen states neighbor, a Mr. White, died a week after he was questioned. Without any questioning regarding a knife, Allen made the following statement: "The two knives I had in my car with blood on them, the blood came from a chicken I had killed."

That known writings of suspect in 1966 in Riverside do not include symbol of circle and cross nor does the writer identify himself as Zodiac.

That all letters identified as the same printing by [redacted] Documents expert, postmarked from 1969 through 1971 bear the name "Zodiac" and contain said circle and cross symbol.

That during interview with Arthur Allen on August 4, 1971, it was noted that Arthur Allen was wearing a Zodiac wristwatch which bore the name "Zodiac" and said symbol. This is the only place other than suspect letters that name Zodiac and symbol \oplus appear together.

That [redacted] states that Arthur Allen received said watch from his mother as a Christmas gift in December, 1967.

That Mr. [redacted] was again contacted and interviewed by the Affiant on September 7, 1972. That [redacted] stated as follows:

"Inspector, I was going to call you. I don't know if it is important, but I thought of something else. Arthur Lee Allen and I discussed in our conversation in December 1967. When Leigh was discussing his plan, I can recall that he asked me how you could disguise your handwriting. I remember my response, I told him I guess you could go to library and get books on writing examination to find out how writing is identified."

That Affiant again asked Mr. [redacted] on September 7, 1972 as to the certainty of his recollection of his conversation with Allen. That Mr. [redacted] is positive as to the statements made by Arthur Allen in December, 1967.

That a .22 Caliber automatic and .22 Caliber ammunition used in the shooting of Betty Jensen and David Farraday December 20, 1968, Solano County.

That a 9 MM automatic and 9 MM ammunition was used in the shooting of Darlene Ferrin and [redacted] on July 4, 1969, Vallejo.

That the following articles were used by suspect in the killing of Cecilia Shepard and wounding of [redacted] in Napa County, September 27, 1969. Black hood with circled cross on same. Large knife having blade approximately twelve inches in length, one inch wide wooden handle with two brass rivets with adhesive tape on handle. That suspect wore wing walker type boots, size 10-12.

That a 9 MM automatic and 9 MM ammunition was used in the killing of PAUL STINE in San Francisco, October 11, 1969. That a portion of PAUL STINE'S shirt was torn from him after the killing. That three pieces of said shirt have been received in mail. That 120 square inches of said shirt are still missing. That wallet and identification were taken from the body of PAUL STINE by suspect, not recovered.

That suspect wore blue windbreaker type jacket which probably was bloodstained.

That Mrs. [redacted] sister-in-law to Arthur Leigh Allen states that Arthur Allen now resides alone in his house trailer at the Sunset Trailer Park at 2963 Santa Rosa Avenue, Santa Rosa, California and is known to keep his personal property in same.

That Mrs. [redacted] Manager of the Sunset Trailer Park, states that Arthur Allen lives in house trailer located in space A-7 in said trailer park.

That Arthur Leigh Allen now resides in a Universal House Trailer. California license AP 6354 located at the Sunset Trailer Park, 2963 Santa Rosa Avenue, Santa Rosa, California. Said trailer is located in space A-7. That Allen also occupies a shed which adjoins said trailer in space A-7.

The murder of PAUL STINE occurred October 11, 1969. The last portion of PAUL STINE'S bloodstained shirt was mailed to Melvin Belli by the suspect on December 20, 1969, indicating that the suspect has retained the fruits of his crimes.

The Affiant requests a Search Warrant to issue for the purpose of searching said Universal trailer, license AP 6354 located in space A-7 at the Sunset Trailer Park, 2963 Santa Rosa Avenue, Santa Rosa, California and said adjoining shed in space A-7.

The Law, Lightly

'Insanity' Defense



By Superior Court Judge Thomas M. Hoag

An old maxim advises that unless changed, it becomes an improvement. It becomes necessary to be changed. The California Supreme Court recently had that threat in mind on September 26th, 1972, when it published its opinion in the case of People vs. Drew, 22 Cal.3d 353, which it modified the legal concept of "insanity."

As the Drew case — a 4-3 decision — pointed out, the state legislature almost had recognized "insanity" as a defense to a criminal charge, but the senators and assemblymen were bothered in doing this, first. Accordingly, since 1964 the defendant's color, open in courts here was that which in 1943 had been committed in McLaughlin's Case, 38 Cal. 2d 711, 222 P.2d 811. To establish a defense on the ground of insanity, it must be clearly proved that, at the time of commission of the act, the party accused was laboring under such a defect of reason, from disease of the mind, as not to make the actor mad and guilty of the act by which he or she had done it, that he did not know he was doing what was wrong.

In the Drew opinion the high court discussed a finding of insanity upon which depended the McLaughlin test, and "applied" the California rule by adopting a test that had been proposed for several years by the American Law Institute: "A person is not responsible for criminal conduct if at the time of such conduct he is afflicted with such a severe mental disease or defect that he is incapable of appreciating the wrongfulness of his conduct or he otherwise has met the requirements set here."

The new rule does not eliminate the defense (but person who knows what he is doing and that it is wrong, but is incapable of controlling his behavior) (the so-called "irresistible impulse"). Ability to distinguish right from wrong is no longer the controlling factor. The change in language is said to be consistent with current legal and psychiatric thought. The Supreme Court concluded "in judgment upon the study of the fragile and often inadequate human being we cannot be frozen into a stereotyped, rigid formula of the past."

Man Once Suspected In Zodiac Case Dies

San Francisco Chronicle Staff Writer

A man once suspected of being the Zodiac killer, who terrified police and terrified death-row Californians with threats of murder, died Wednesday in Vallejo of a heart attack at the age of 51.

In 1971, attention focused on Arthur (ALLEN) ALLEN when relatives and friends told police that he was acting suspiciously and that they feared he might be the sickle slayer who killed at least six people and perhaps as many as 17 between 1968 and 1974.

In his book "Zodiac," former Chronicle editor and national reporter Chapman described Allen under a California name as "the candidate of most detectives" for the Zodiac killer. Chapman's article was not reached for comment yesterday.

Former San Francisco police detective Dave Tusch said yesterday that Allen was investigated as a suspect in 1971 and his trailer was searched, but there was not enough evidence to file charges against him or any other suspect.

Allen had reportedly told some people that he was the Zodiac killer.

"Mr. Allen was a very, very good suspect," Tusch said. "We looked into Mr. Allen very closely."

In the mid-1970s, Allen was convicted of child-molestation charges and sentenced to prison, said Vallejo Police Captain Roy Conway.

Last year, the Vallejo Police Department searched Allen's home in Vallejo as part of a three-agency investigation into the unsolved case.

"We found some weapons, some pipe bombs, some illegal weapons," Conway said. "None of it was sufficient to make an arrest for him being the Zodiac."

Conway said Allen, who for many years was unemployed and lived on phantasmal earnings, corresponded with police. The letters described Allen as highly intelligent. He interests included fishing and Huckleberry Cakes.

Conway said there have been scores of 1,000 suspects in the Zodiac case.

The killer who pulled himself into the Zodiac case scribbled letters with coded clues in newspapers and dairies about a string of murders which occurred in Vallejo, Lakeview, San Francisco and Hayward.

"It was like he was taunting us and saying, 'I'm better than you and smarter than you,'" Tusch said. "He actually set out a challenge and said, 'Check me if you can.'"

Last year, a Vallejo lawyer held a press conference to announce that his dead brother had been the

Zodiac killer, William L. Herman, privately published a manuscript entitled "Jack the Zodiac" in which he wrote that 794 pieces of circumstantial evidence pointed to his brother, Jack Herman.

Vallejo police
continue to zero in
on onetime prime

VALLEJO — Arthur Allen claims he once got a letter from the Department of Justice certifying that he is not California's most elusive mass murderer.

He can't show it to you now. He says the Vallejo police seized it this year when they raided his house in their latest attempt to prove he is the Zodiac killer — the infamous serial killer who terrorized the state a generation ago, then disappeared without a trace.

"This damned thing has been haunting me for 22 years," Allen said Thursday in an interview about his life as a perennial prime suspect in the Zodiac murders. "If I was prone to suicide, I'd have already done it . . . The only thing in my favor is, I've never killed anyone."

Allen, 52, said he is a disabled former school teacher who once served three years in a state mental hospital for molesting a child, and who used to wear a "Zodiac" brand skin diver's watch.

Since he was targeted as a Zodiac suspect in 1971, Allen says he has been fingerprinted, interrogated, made to give handwriting samples and subjected to a 10-hour long Justice Department lie-detector test.

Allen claims, and police agree, that he has passed every evidentiary test the cops have thrown at him, and says he so convincingly professed his innocence on the polygraph that the Justice Department wrote him a letter absolving

him of guilt.

Despite all that, the Vallejo police in February made him the target of yet another Zodiac probe — and by Allen's account, ransacked his house, took his Zodiac watch and his letter from the Justice Department, and asked him the same old questions.

Handguns, explosives taken

Also taken in the raid were several handguns and some explosives that Allen said he obtained years ago from a friend he met in the mental hospital.

Allen was never arrested. But five months after the raid he says the police have refused to return his property, but still claim they possess "damning evidence" of his guilt, he says.

"No way in hell could I go out and kill innocent teenie-boppers — no way," Allen said. "But with (the police), I'm guilty until I'm proven innocent, and I figure the case will be around until I die."

Police won't disclose their reasons for searching Allen's house. A Vallejo judge has kept the search warrant under seal for five months, although state law appears to require that warrants be made public 10 days after they are issued.

Judge J. Paul Dary did not respond to interview requests.

The Zodiac was a publicity-mad gunman who between 1966-69 killed four young women, a

unprovoked attacks in Vallejo, Calif., and The City. During his spree, the killer wrote a series of letters to newspapers daring police to stop him before he killed again.

'This is the Zodiac speaking'

The letters often began with the greeting, "This is the Zodiac speaking" and they were decorated with a symbol that looked like the cross-hairs in a rifle scope. The letters made the crimes internationally famous, and for years police worked double-time trying to track down the Zodiac.

According to Dave Tocchi, a retired San Francisco police inspector who investigated the Zodiac slayings, Allen was first targeted in 1971, when he was a student at Sonoma State College in Cotati.

An acquaintance told police that Allen had confided that he was fantasizing about committing mass murder, Tocchi recalled. The police were also reportedly intrigued by other evidence including Allen's Zodiac watch, which was adorned with a symbol like the ones on the Zodiac letters.

Police searched two cars and a trailer Allen had in Santa Rosa, Tocchi said, and found nothing to implicate him.

Allen's handwriting samples did not match the Zodiac letters, and Allen also passed the polygraph, Tocchi recalled.

"Allen looked very, very good for a while," Tocchi said. "(But) everything turned out to be nega-
